# 1662. CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

# 1666. BRANSTON DELPH

The Director of Operations reported on emails received from the Environment Agency requesting more information regarding dates of the seepage events. S. F. Cobb, Dr. V. Stanton and D Armstrong all expressed concern at the lack of progress.

It was agreed that the Director of Operations should arrange a site meeting with representatives of the Environment Agency as soon as possible and report to the next meeting.

# 1669. Defra Visit 8<sup>th</sup> December 2011

Members thanked the Board's staff for arranging the visit to the three Lincoln based Boards. It was generally felt that the visit had been a success, and gave the Defra Staff an ideal opportunity to see the positive outcomes achieved by the three Boards' operations.

# **1670.** Total Environment

Members noted that proposals were being revised following a Lincolnshire wide meeting including IDBs, the Environment Agency, and Lincolnshire County Council on 15<sup>th</sup> December 2011. The earliest possible start date would now be 1<sup>st</sup> April 2013.

# 1672. Tenders For Replacement Of Wheeled Excavator and Replacement Flail Mower

It was RESOLVED, on the recommendation of the Executive Committee, to accept the tender from Terex Atlas for supply of an Atlas 140W and the tender from Grundy Agricultural for the supply of a Bomford B8181 with trade in.

# <u>1673. LAND DRAINAGE ACT 1991 SECTION 37(2)</u>

It was *RESOLVED* that the drainage rates and special levies for 2012/13 be calculated on an annual value of £4,531,788.

# 1674. DRAINAGE RATES AND SPECIAL LEVIES

The Senior Finance and Rating Officer presented the estimates and explained variances between planned and projected expenditure in the current year and proposals for 2012/13.

It was proposed by G. Hewson, seconded by R. Coupland and RESOLVED:-

1. That the proportions of their expenditure to be raised by Drainage Rates on agricultural land and buildings and by Special Levies on the local billing authorities be 67.71% and 32.29% respectively.

2. To make the Drainage Rates and Special Levies as set out below under the official seal of the Board.

The Chairman and Chief Executive were authorised to seal the Rate.

# 1675. BRIDGE LIABILITY

The Board received a detailed report regarding the Board's potential liability for bridges and culverts within the drainage district. The report outlined the structures thought to be in the Board's ownership and the estimated cost of transferring liability to the Lincolnshire County Council. The methodology used by Lincolnshire County Council to calculate the liabilities at £405,000 was being verified and a further report would be prepared. The potential future implications of financing any future transfer of ownership were also outlined in the report, together with finding options.

It was Agreed that once the Board's Engineer had verified Lincolnshire County Council's calculations the matter be referred back to the Board for further discussion. The Chairman and the Chief Executive to convene a Special Meeting of the Board, if necessary.

# 1676. FIVE MILE LANE WASHINGBOROUGH DEVELOPMENT

The Board received an updated report prepared by the Board's Engineer, different from the paper sent out with the agenda only because the position is fast moving. The report highlighted the need for the contractor to install a dewatering system to position the oil interceptor. The report also noted that no significant progress had been made since 20<sup>th</sup> January 2012.

Members expressed further concern over the development and instructed the Engineer to continue to closely monitor the situation, whilst accepting that the Board had no contractor supervision powers and the Engineer was able to work in an advisory role only.

# 1677. DRAINAGE RATES

It was reported that 98% of the direct rates due had been collected to date.
